The Affordable Care Act became a law in March 2010.
Since then....

1 MILLIONS COVERED

Millions of adults who were uninsured now have health coverage -many for the first time. This includes:

- 3 million African-American adults¹
- 4 million Hispanic adults²
- 1 million Asian American and Pacific Islander adults³



Number of clinicians in the National Health Service Corps (NHSC) has more than doubled since 2008.⁴



3 IN-PERSON ASSISTANCE

The ACA has helped create in-person assisters to help consumers navigate the health insurance environment.⁵



About 85 percent of current consumers and those who are eligible qualify for tax credits.⁶
